Competition


- Schedule and warm-up times
- Training on Wednesday evening, enter from 17:30hrs
- Call room & Withdrawals
- All distances have an A and B-final, except 800m and 1500m
- 50m freestyle & 100 en 200m's will have a junior final
- The eight fastest swimmers from the heats will qualify for the A-finals
- B-finals will only be scheduled when 4 or more swimmers are available
- Para swimmers will be seeded in the heats according to entry times
- The 8 para swimmers with the highest point ranking will proceed to the final
- Referees & starters

Referee / rules

 Judging of the swimming rules (strokes) will be in accordance with the World Aquatics rule book. Further the competition will take place in accordance with the Dutch KNZB rule book.

QUALIFICATION

- All swimmers must report to the callroom at least 10 minutes prior to the published starttime of their own event in thestartlist. If a swimmer is too late at the callroom he/she will not swim. In the final the reserve will swim instead of theswimmer who is too late.
- Finals reserves: The two reserves for the B-final (qualified as nr. 17 & 18 in the heats after withdrawls) will be the reserves for the A-final as well as the B-final.
- The reserves must report to the callroom for both finals, at least 10 minutes prior to the published starttime of the final in the startlist. In case the reserve will swim in the A-final, he/she will not be eligible to swim in the B-final.



- Junior finals: Instead of article 3.2 'Junior swimmers' third bullit:
 - Juniors can qualify for A-final in all events. If a junior qualifies for the A-final he/she must swim the A-final and will not be eligible to swim the junior-final.
 - In case of an event with a junior final, a junior is never a reserve for the A-final or B-final, only a reserve for the junior-final.
- Paralympic finals: Instead of article 3.2 'Paralympic swimmers' fifth bullit:
 - Para swimmers can qualify for A-final in all events. If a para swimmer qualifies for the A-final he/she must swim the A-final and will not be eligible to swim the para-final.
 - In case of an event with a paralympic final, a para swimmer is never a reserve for the A-final or B-final, only a reserve for the para-final.

Video Review



- Will be used as part of the officials' decision making
- The use of Video Review will be in accordance with the Dutch KNZB Rule Book. Judging of swimming rules (strokes) will follow the World Aquatics Rule Book.
- Images above (incl. 15 m mark) and under water will be observed live by experienced referees
- Rule infractions reported from the pooldeck will be reviewed in slow-motion, where
 possible and available
- Objective: contribute to a more fair field of play, by observing which cannot be seen from the pooldeck and which is wrongly DQ-ed from the pooldeck
- In case of a DQ confirmed by the Video the coach/swimmer may see the video <u>after</u> <u>the session</u> (request to the referee)
